This yarn is now available in Cream, Taupe and Ash.

Ash is our new shade and is available in 4ply and 8ply. It's a warm grey/beige/fawn blend. Beautiful on its own or dyed for rich tones.

You will also start to see some new colours added to our commercially dyed yarn range.

Tarndwarncoort now has a super skinny Nm23/2 yarn for the handweavers with good strength and thickness. This yarn is 100% naturally coloured Polwarth wool and it hasn't been superwash treated. We are also able to dye special orders to meet your required colour scheme. This yarn is available on cones in 250gm and also 1kg cones.
